


Jay Bachman


Andy Braaten








NDHSAA Tournament Code of Conduct

Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools and their personnel.

FUNDAMENTALS OF GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP

- 1. Know, appreciate and understand the rules of the contest.
- 2. Show respect for the officials. Good Sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
- 3. Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
- 4. Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
- 5. Maintain self control at all times. Good Sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
- 6. Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good Sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory".

COACHES SHALL:

- 1. Follow the rules of the sport during the progress of the contest.
- $2. \ \mbox{Accept}$ the decision of officials without showing inappropriate emotions.
- 3. Exhibit encouragement to players going in and coming out of a game/meet.
- 4. Avoid public display of criticism in front of participants or spectators.

TEAMS SHALL:

- 1. Display qualities of Good Sportsmanship at all times.
- 2. Display respect for opponents at all times, including injured players. EXAMPLE: Assisting an opponent who has fallen as opposed to stepping over him/her.
- 3. Avoid unsportsmanlike gestures or language. EXAMPLE: Taunting an opponent after a missed shot, etc.
- 4. Respect the judgment of game officials. EXAMPLE: Protesting a call verbally and/or demonstratively.
- 5. Concentrate on being involved in the contest with as little regard for the spectators as possible. EXAMPLE: Joining in with spectators in unsportsmanlike conduct.
- 6. Accept victory and/or defeat with pride and compassion. EXAMPLE: Shaking hands with the opponents after the contest in a sportsmanlike manner.
- 7. Exhibit proper etiquette in pre-game ceremonies. EXAMPLE: Display proper behavior during the national anthem, the introduction of players, etc.
- 8. Display ethical behavior throughout the contest. EXAMPLE: No behavior which would include possible injurious actions such as the swinging of elbows, tripping, pushing back after being bumped, etc.

FANS SHALL:

- 1. Refrain from throwing any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
- 2. Refrain from behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
- 3. Refrain from possessing, consuming or being under the influence of chemicals.
- 4. Refrain from use of obscene, profane or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
- 5. Refrain from the use of artificial noisemakers.
- 6. Refrain from entry onto the playing surface.

THESE ARE ACTS OF MISCONDUCT THAT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AND WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC REMOVAL WITHOUT REFUND OF ADMISSION!

CROWD CONTROL

- 1. Officials should be encouraged to call penalties on crowd or to cancel or postpone games because of improper crowd behavior.
- 2. The host school administration is responsible for crowd control and may call the game because of fan misconduct and postpone the conclusion of a game until a later time with no spectators present.
- 3. Student spectators guilty of misconduct should be removed from the arena and charged with disorderly conduct and/or may be barred from attending future contests.
- 4. All school regulations should be in effect at all contests, even though the contest might not be held in a school owned facility.
