

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION BRIEF HISTORY

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923, the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High School League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time.

Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three-class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time.

Official state champions have been named in track since 1908 and in basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: golf and tennis 1938; baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; cross country 1961; hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; boys' & girls' swimming 1974. State football championships were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1952 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Association-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated A and B champions in 2012.



A 25 Year Tribute to the Past 1996 CHAMPIONS – MINTO ROCKETS

The Minto Rockets made their first ever appearance at a NDHSAA Class B girls basketball state tournament in 1996 and made the most of it by winning a state championship and completing an undefeated season.

The Rockets were dominant in 1996 scoring an average of 68 points per game and allowing only an average of 41 points to their opponents. On its way to the state tournament played at the Bismarck Civic Center, Minto won the District 4 and Region 2 girls basketball tournaments. Minto's starting five of Angie Schanilec, Ginger Schanilec, Jana Selseth, Jayne Boeddeker and Katie Kilichowski all received All-District 4 honors.

The 1996 NDHSAA Class B girls basketball state tournament field was made up of Minto, Bottineau, Richardton-Taylor, Washburn, Lehr/ Wishek, Pingree-Buchanan/Kensal, Watford City and Kindred. Minto opened with a 58-47 win over Pingree-Buchanan/Kensal in the quarterfinals and followed it up with a 59-42 win over Washburn in the semifinals.

Minto squared off with Richardton-Taylor in the championship game and when the final buzzer sounded the Rockets exited the court with a 57-36 win and a perfect 28-0 season. Boeddeker and Kilichowski were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Following the season, the Rockets were named the 1996-1997 NDAPSSA High School Female Team of the Year.

Other highlights from the 1996 season for the Rockets included Selseth, Boeddeker, and Kilichowski scoring their 1,000th points of their careers. Kilichowski reached her 1,000th point milestone in the state championship game.

Boeddeker, a NDAPSSA Miss Basketball finalist, received NDAPSSA All-State First Team honors and Kilichowski was named to the NDAPSSA All-State Second Team.

Prior to the 1997 season, the Oakes Tornadoes had qualified for the NDHSAA Class B girls basketball state tournament three times (1976, 1985 and 1992), but had never won a state title. That all changed in the fall of 1997 when the Tornadoes completed an undefeated path to the program's first state championship.

In 1996, Oakes had lost to Kindred in the Region 1 semifinals ending the campaign 24-1. Once the 1997 season rolled around, a strong group of returners from the 1996 Tornadoes squad took the floor and quickly became known for their press defense and perimeter shooting.

The Tornadoes were also balanced offensively and disciplined on defense. All starters on the team averaged between 8.5 and 13 points per game. On defense, six players recorded 50-plus steals on the season – a product of the press/trap defense they applied on opponents, who only averaged 35.8 points per game against the Tornadoes.

Oakes averaged 61.7 points per game and defeated Class A Wahpeton 52-39 during the regular season.

The well-balanced Tornadoes punched their ticket to the state tournament with a 53-26 win over Richland in the Region 1 championship game. Joining Oakes at the 1997 NDHSAA Class B state tournament were Richardton-Taylor, Hazen, Central Valley, Starkweather/Munich, Linton, Stanley and Midkota.

Oakes opened state with a 50-42 win over Richardton-Taylor with Kelli Moore leading the Tornadoes with 15 points followed by Erica Visto who posted a double-double effort (14 points and 11 rebounds). In the semifinals, Oakes topped Starkweather/Munich 56-34 with Sarah McLean leading the Tornadoes with 15 points.

The Tornadoes would meet Hazen in the championship winning 53-40. The title game was highlighted by Oakes' defense holding the Bison to 38 percent shooting from the field and forcing 16 turnovers, compared to only four committed by the Tornadoes. The Tornadoes balanced offense was on display at state as Becky Rodine led the team in the scoring with 18 points – the third different player to lead the team in scoring in the three state tournament games played at the Bismarck Civic Center.

Oakes finished the season 28-0. McLean, Moore and Visto were named to the All-Tournament Team with Visto earning Tournament MVP honors.

The History of Basketball

Invention of the game

The game of basketball as it is known today was created by Dr. James Naismith in December 1891 in Springfield, Massachusetts, to condition young athletes during cold months. It consisted of peach



baskets and a soccer style ball. He published 13 rules for the new game. He divided his class of eighteen into two teams of nine players each and set about to teach them the basics of his new game. The objective of the game was to throw the basketball into the fruit baskets nailed to the lower railing of the gym balcony. Every time a point was scored, the game was halted so the janitor could bring out a ladder and retrieve the ball. After a while, the bottoms of the fruit baskets were removed. The first public basketball game was played in Springfield, Massachusetts, on March 11, 1892.


The first basketball game

On December 21, 1891, James Naismith published rules for a new game using five basic ideas and thirteen rules. That day, he asked his class to play a match in the Armory Street court: 9 versus 9, using a soccer ball and two peach baskets. Frank Mahan, one of his students, wasn't so happy. He just said: "Harrumph. Another new game". However, Naismith was the inventor of the new game. Someone proposed to call it "Naismith Game", but he suggested "We have a ball and a basket: why don't we call it basketball?" There were other differences between Naismith's first idea and the game played today. The peach baskets were closed, and balls had to be retrieved manually, until a small hole was put in the bottom of the peach basket to poke the ball out using a stick. Only in 1906 were metal hoops, nets and backboards introduced. Moreover, earlier the soccer ball was replaced by a Spalding ball, similar to the one used today.

Professional leagues, teams, and organizations

The first professional league was founded in 1898. Six teams took part in the National Basketball League, and the first champions were the Trenton Nationals, followed by the New York Wanderers, the Bristol Pile Drivers and the Camden Electrics. The league was abandoned in 1904. Then, many small championships were organized, but most of them were not as important as some teams who played for money against challengers.

The Original Celtics, for instance, are considered the "fathers of basketball" and were presented as "World's Basketball Champions"; the players had to sign a contract to play with them, and Jim Furey organized matches as a circus, moving daily from town to town. The Celtics became the strongest team, and their successes lasted from 1922 until 1928, when the team disbanded due to ownership problems. The Original Celtics are sometimes incorrectly thought of as forebears of the current Boston Celtics of the NBA; in reality, they share only a name, as today's Celtics were not founded until 1946, nearly two decades after the demise of the Original Celtics.

NDHSAA MINIMAL BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS:

- Respect the American flag and the National Anthem.
- Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest.
- Spectators must wear clothing that covers the entire torso. Those who do not comply or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this behavior expectation.
- The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators.
- Any attendee ejected from a NDHSAA tournament venue will be banned from the venue(s) for the remainder of the event.
- Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way.
- Hand held signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing surface is NOT allowed.
- Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues.
 Exception – Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials.
- Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited.
- Confetti is banned at all NDHSAA tournament venues. Tournament staff is instructed to confiscate such articles at the door.
- Objects shall not be thrown into the stands at any NDHSAA tournament venue.
- The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited for any persons at NDHSAA tournament venues.


