In 1998 the Velva Aggies girls basketball team did something no other team in the program's history had ever done – qualify for a state tournament. The 1998 NDHSAA Class B Girls Basketball State Tournament would be played in Minot – only 20 miles from Velva, but an early winter storm just prior to the tournament forced even the Aggies to expediate their travel plans to the Magic City.

Minot Police and North Dakota Highway Patrol met the Aggies' team bus at the Highway and lifted the "No Travel Gate" to let them into the city limits. Once in Minot the Aggies' focus was solely on making their first trip to state a meaningful one punctuated by a championship.

Velva entered state undefeated at 25-0. The Aggies' opponent in the quarterfinals was May-Port-CG, who like Velva played aggressive defense. The Patriots would hold the Aggies well below their 61 points per game average as the game would go to overtime, however, Velva emerged victorious 45-42.

The Aggies were led by the trio of Jessie Slinde, Chelsea Hausauer and Jennifer Miller who averaged double figures in scoring during the 1998 season. Slinde would be a finalist for the NDAPSSA Miss Basketball Award in 1998 and Hausauer would be an NDAPSSA Miss Basketball finalist in 2000 during her senior season.

In the semifinals, Velva would meet Gackle-Streeter. A key 18-0 run in the second quarter put the Aggies in control of the game early and eventually the squad picked up the 58-34 victory. The team that had spent the entire season defining what it meant to play "AGGIE BASKETBALL" was now only one win away from a state championship. Velva's opponent in the state championship game was Watford City.

Against the Wolves, Velva flexed its offensive might and cruised to a 68-50 win to complete the undefeated season at 28-0 and bring home a state championship trophy.

Tournament MVP honors went to Jennifer Miller. Slinde and Hausauer joined Miller on the All-Tournament team.

Aggies head coach David Peterson earned NDHSCA Class B Girls Basketball Coach of the Year honors following the tournament.

The 1998 undefeated girls basketball season remains one of Velva High School's most revered athletic team achievements.

NDHSAA Tournament Code of Conduct

Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools and their personnel.

FUNDAMENTALS OF GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP

- 1. Know, appreciate and understand the rules of the contest.
- 2. Show respect for the officials. Good Sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
- 3. Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
- 4. Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
- 5. Maintain self control at all times. Good Sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
- 6. Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good Sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory".

COACHES SHALL:

- 1. Follow the rules of the sport during the progress of the contest.
- 2. Accept the decision of officials without showing inappropriate emotions.
- 3. Exhibit encouragement to players going in and coming out of a game/meet.
- 4. Avoid public display of criticism in front of participants or spectators.

"Good sportsmanship is displaying a commitment to fair play, ethics and integrity. Please display good sportsmanship throughout the tournament.

THANK YOU. Spectators displaying any unsportsmanlikeconduct such as, but not limited to taunting, baiting or carrying flags around the arena, will be removed".

TEAMS SHALL:

- 1. Display qualities of Good Sportsmanship at all times.
- 2. Display respect for opponents at all times, including injured players. EXAMPLE: Assisting an opponent who has fallen as opposed to stepping over him/her.
- 3. Avoid unsportsmanlike gestures or language. EXAMPLE: Taunting an opponent after a missed shot, etc.
- 4. Respect the judgment of game officials. EXAMPLE: Protesting a call verbally and/or demonstratively.
- 5. Concentrate on being involved in the contest with as little regard for the spectators as possible. EXAMPLE: Joining in with spectators in unsportsmanlike conduct.
- 6. Accept victory and/or defeat with pride and compassion. EXAMPLE: Shaking hands with the opponents after the contest in a sportsmanlike manner.
- 7. Exhibit proper etiquette in pre-game ceremonies. EXAMPLE: Display proper behavior during the national anthem, the introduction of players, etc.
- 8. Display ethical behavior throughout the contest. EXAMPLE: No behavior which would include possible injurious actions such as the swinging of elbows, tripping, pushing back after being bumped, etc.

FANS SHALL:

- 1. Refrain from throwing any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
- 2. Refrain from behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
- 3. Refrain from possessing, consuming or being under the influence of chemicals.
- 4. Refrain from use of obscene, profane or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
- 5. Refrain from the use of artificial noisemakers.
- 6. Refrain from entry onto the playing surface.

THESE ARE ACTS OF MISCONDUCT THAT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AND WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC REMOVAL WITHOUT REFUND OF ADMISSION!

CROWD CONTROL

- 1. Officials should be encouraged to call penalties on crowd or to cancel or postpone games because of improper crowd behavior.
- 2. The host school administration is responsible for crowd control and may call the game because of fan misconduct and postpone the conclusion of a game until a later time with no spectators present.
- 3. Student spectators guilty of misconduct should be removed from the arena and charged with disorderly conduct and/or may be barred from attending future contests.
- 4. All school regulations should be in effect at all contests, even though the contest might not be held in a school owned facility.
