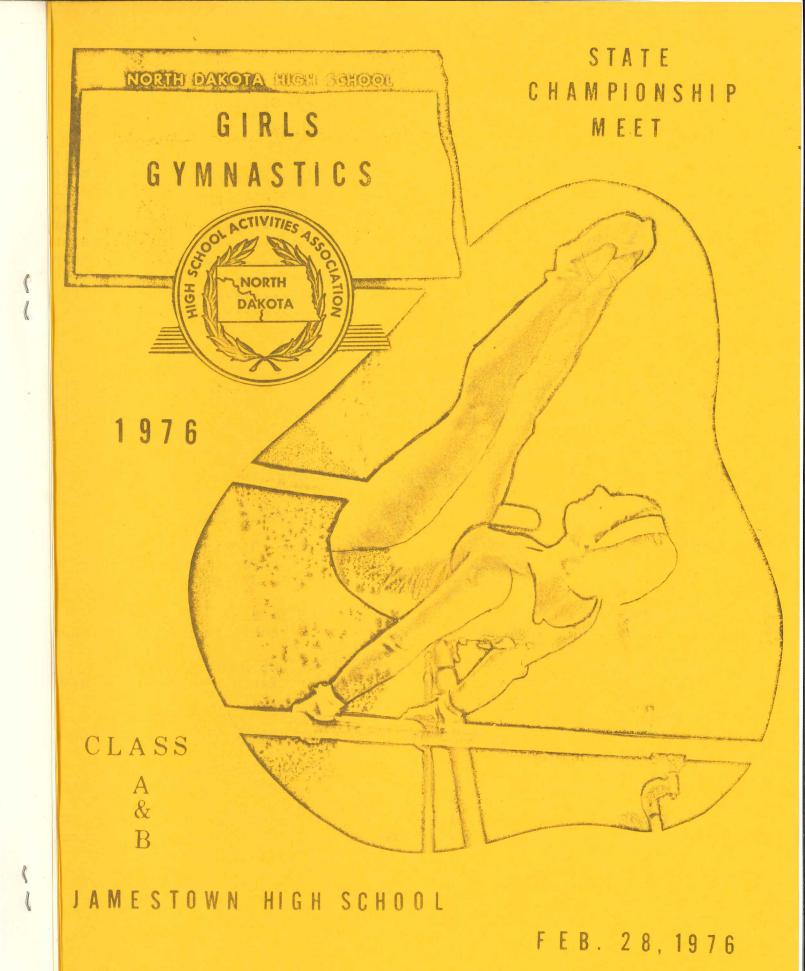

The gymnast must propel herself over a 43" high padded horse. A standard vault is a front handspring, but complex acrobatics like a half turn into a back somersault, have been performed with success in high school competition. A gymnast is scored on the best of her two vaults, each one taking about one and a half seconds to complete. A good vaulter will have a straight back, smooth flight, good height before and after horse contact, and a controlled landing in her vault.

### VAULTING





With its music, freer and larger movements, fast tumbling passes and opportunity for much more creative expression, the floor exercise is often the favorite event among gymnasts.

The superior routines are really dances that are performed with the ease and grace of ballet, but including very difficult tumbling such as the back-twisting full somersaults.

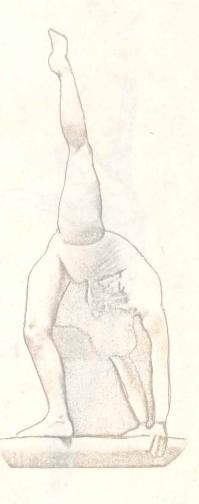
This is a very fast-moving event, with the best exercises being predominantly those of swinging movements between and around the two bars (the bars are 59" and 90" off the floor). The gymnasts are to be judged on their fluidity, as well as their ability to perform the difficult and the dangerous moves (such as flips and twists). The gymnast loses points for stops, extra swings before a move, falls from the bars, alternate hand grasps, or letting the feet touch the floor.

This is probably the most challenging event in girls gymnastics since the gymnast must literally tumble and dance on a 4 inch wide by a 16 foot long beam, which is 4 feet off the ground.

A gymnast will lose .5 points for falling off the beam or losing her balance so severely that she must grasp the beam.

Her performance must be steady and graceful, and must include difficult acrobatics, such as the aerials, and somersaults; all the while she must smile and play to the audience.

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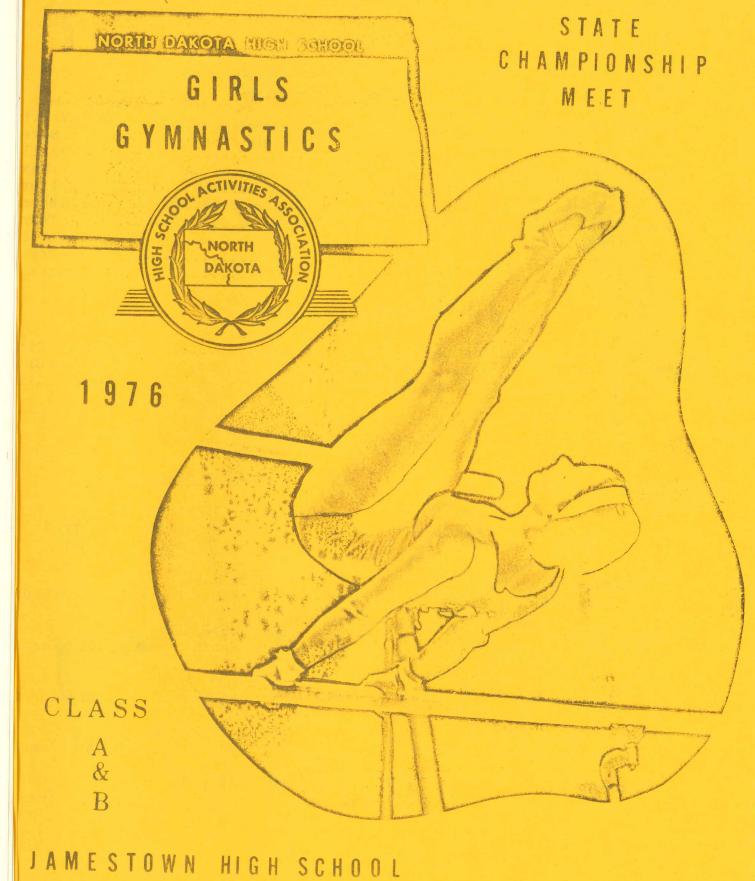
