1967 Champions Grand Forks Central

The 1967 Grand Forks Central boys hockey team will forever be remembered as winners of the first North Dakota High School Activities Association-sponsored state boys hockey tournament. Though 1966-67 was the first season the NDHSAA officially sponsored boys hockey, the state's high school teams began organizing a state tournament starting in 1961. Central was the state's boys hockey power in that era as the 1967 squad won the program's seventh straight state title under the direction of legendary head coach Serge Gambucci.

Central skated to a 22-0 record during the 1966-67 season and was the first team in school history to record an undefeated season. Prior to state, Central posted big

victories against Roseau, International Falls, Thief River Falls, Baudette, Hibbing and Warroad – all known as traditionally successful high school boys hockey programs in Minnesota.

Central opened the 1967 state tournament with a 13-0 win over Bottineau and followed up with a 6-1 victory over Grafton in the semifinals setting up a meeting with Fargo North in the championship game.

After a slow start in its semifinal with the Spoilers, Central picked up the pace against the Spartans scoring one minute, 53 seconds into the game when defenseman Tim O'Keefe picked up a loose puck and put a shot past North goalie John Miller.

Central skated to a 3-0 lead

after the first period and extended the lead to 6-0 after two periods of play. North never got into a rhythm and only produced six shots on goal – all of which were stopped by Central goalie Bill Roller, who notched his second shutout of the tournament. The perfect season was complete as Central celebrated a 7-0 win over the Spartans.

Jim Charlesworth and Scott Leigh each scored two goals for Central. Jim Gambucci and Rick Nelson also scored for Central. In addition to his first-period goal, O'Keefe added two assists in the game that helped further cement Central's dominance in North Dakota high school boys hockey in the 1960s and early 1970s.

The 1992 North Dakota High School Activities Association Boys Hockey State Tournament marked the first time in the event's history that two West Region teams met in the championship game – thus guaranteeing for the first time a West Region team would win a state title.

Minot and Bismarck squared off in the championship with the Magicians skating to an 8-7 win. It was a high-paced, dramatic championship game that was played before a crowd of 5,200 fans in Grand Forks.

Junior center Tom Philion scored the game-winning goal for the Magicians at the 13 minute, 23 second mark of the third period. It was the 15th goal scored in the

game – a new championship game record. Minutes later, Minot was celebrating a state championship – a first for a West Region team in the event's 32-year history.

Philion's game-winner was the punctuation on what was an offensively-dominated contest. There was a span in the championship game where four goals were scored in the span of two minutes.

Philion ended the title game with two goals and three assists against the Demons. Both of Philion's goals were scored in the third period. Philion was named Tournament MVP recording eight goals and seven assists during the three-day event tying a tournament record with 15 points held by Grand Forks Central's Dennis

Johnson in 1970.

Bismarck had outscored Minot by a combined 22-5 in two regular season meetings making the back-and-forth championship somewhat of a surprise.

The Magicians opened the tournament with a 6-2 win over Grafton/Park River and followed up with a 7-3 victory of Fargo North in the semifinals.

Mike Hanson, Chris Knittel, Mike Blessum, Eric Misuraca also scored goals for Minot in the championship game. Hanson and Blessum each scored two goals. Junior goalie Dan Leshovsky recorded 19 saves in net for Minot.

Minot finished its magical 1992 season with an 18-6-0 record.

Coach

Mike Peluso is in his ninth year as head coach for the Bismarck Demons hockey team. A 1993 graduate of Bismarck High, in 1991-2 Peluso set the North Dakota high school single-season scoring record of 99 points (in just 23 games). Peluso played with the Omaha Lancers of the USHL from 1992-1994 and was selected to the USHL All-Star Game in 1993 and 1994.

In 1998 Mike was signed as a free agent by the Washington Capitals. His NHL career included stops in St. Louis, Chicago, and Philadelphia.

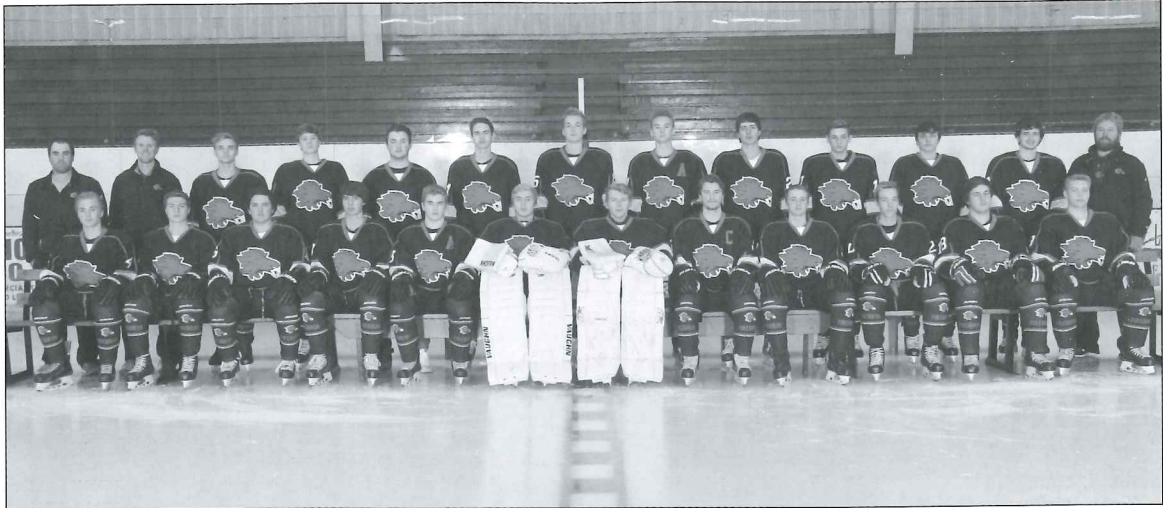

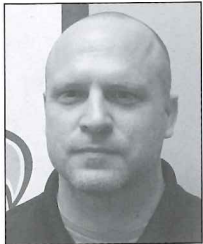

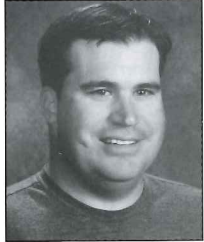
Coach

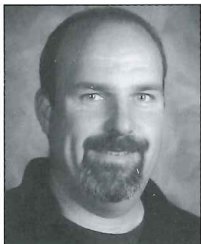

I. Membership

The NDSHAA is a voluntary non-profit organization of the high schools in the State of North Dakota. All schools eligible for membership belong to the Association. Membership is granted upon application of the School Board, at which time the school agrees to enforce the rules which the members have established and to participate in the legislative process of modification and revision of rules to fit the changing needs of member schools and students.

II. Purpose as per NDHSAA Constitution

The purpose of the Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- a. Administering a program of interscholastic activities, clinics, contests and festivals among its member schools;
- b. Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with school activities;
- c. Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation of special interest groups;
- d. Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program;
- e. Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

III. Brief History

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls' sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two- class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three- class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in boys' track since 1908 and in boys' basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: boys' golf and boys' tennis 1938, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; boys' cross country 1961; boys' hockey 1967; girls' track, golf and tennis 1966; girls' gymnastics 1969; girls' basketball 1974; girls' swimming 1974, boys' swimming 1975 and girls cross country 1979. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but again restored in 1975. Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1951 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls' basketball was reinstated as an Association-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls' volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys' state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls' state soccer champions in 1996. Girls' state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls' softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.

IV. Activities

The following chart indicates the activities sponsored by the Association, the number of senior high schools participating and the approximate number of students participating in interscholastic competition during the 2015-16 school year.

V. Registration of Officials and Interpretation Meetings

More than 1,497 officials are registered with NDHSAA. These men and woman are furnished rule books for the sports in which they officiate, and examinations are provided annually in baseball, basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, volleyball and wrestling. Officials are also required to complete on-line rules clinics in all sports and workshops in baseball, basketball, football, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

VI. Cheerleader Clinics

The NDHSAA has recognized the importance of safety in cheerleading. Because of this, the Association has added rules/safety clinics for head cheer coaches of all member schools who have cheerleaders. These clinics recognize the importance of informing cheer coaches of proper safety techniques as well as emphasizing the responsibility of cheerleaders for sportsmanship and crowd control.

VII. Organization of Association

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of 11 members. Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A Schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. Four administrators of Class B schools, one high school principal as a member-at-large, and one athletic administrator. These representatives are elected by the membership as a whole, with each school having one vote. In addition, a representative of the North Dakota School Boards Association and the Superintendent of Public Instruction serve as a member of the Board.

REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

The superintendent or high school principal or athletic administrator of each school serves as a member of the representative assembly, with each school being entitled to one vote. An annual meeting is held each year to adopt rules and regulations governing inter-school contests and eligibility regulations. All such rules are made by the representative assembly.

DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The district activities are controlled and managed by committees elected by school officials in each area.

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The administration of the various programs and the implementation of the policies of the Association are placed in the hands of the Executive Director, one Associate and three Assistants who are employed by the Association.

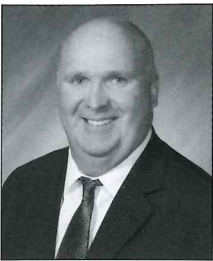

NDHSAA TOURNAMENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Purpose: To elevate standards of Good Sportsmanship and to encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, member schools, and their personnel.

Fundamentals of Good Sportsmanship

1. Know, appreciate, and understand the rules of the contest.
2. Show respect for the officials. Good sportsmanship implies the willingness to accept and abide by the decisions of the officials.
3. Show respect for the opponent at all times. Good Sportsmanship is the Golden Rule in action.
4. Recognize and appreciate the skill of performance regardless of team affiliation.
5. Maintain self control at all times. Good sportsmanship is a responsibility of all who are involved in the game.
6. Show a positive attitude in cheering, refraining from intimidation or negative cheering. Good sportsmanship is cheering your own team "on to victory."

Acts of Misconduct

1. Throwing of any object onto the playing floor or in the stands.
2. Behavior deemed dangerous or which interferes with the rights of others to watch the game.
3. Possessing, consuming, or being under the influence of chemicals.
4. Use of obscene, profane, or abusive language or gestures, signs, posters, or banners which show disrespect for opponent's team, officials, cheerleaders, band or other performing groups.
5. The use of noisemakers.
6. Entry onto the playing surface at any time.

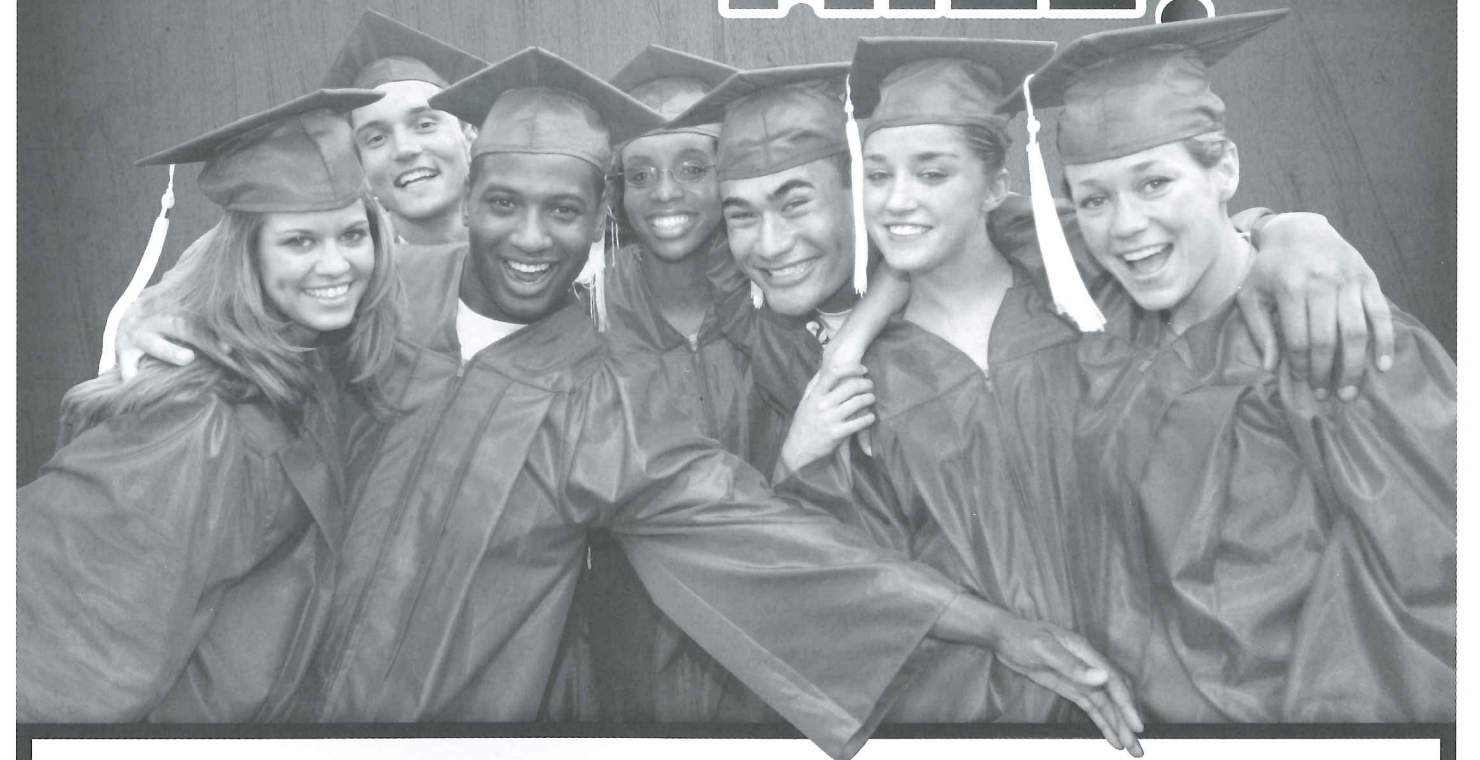

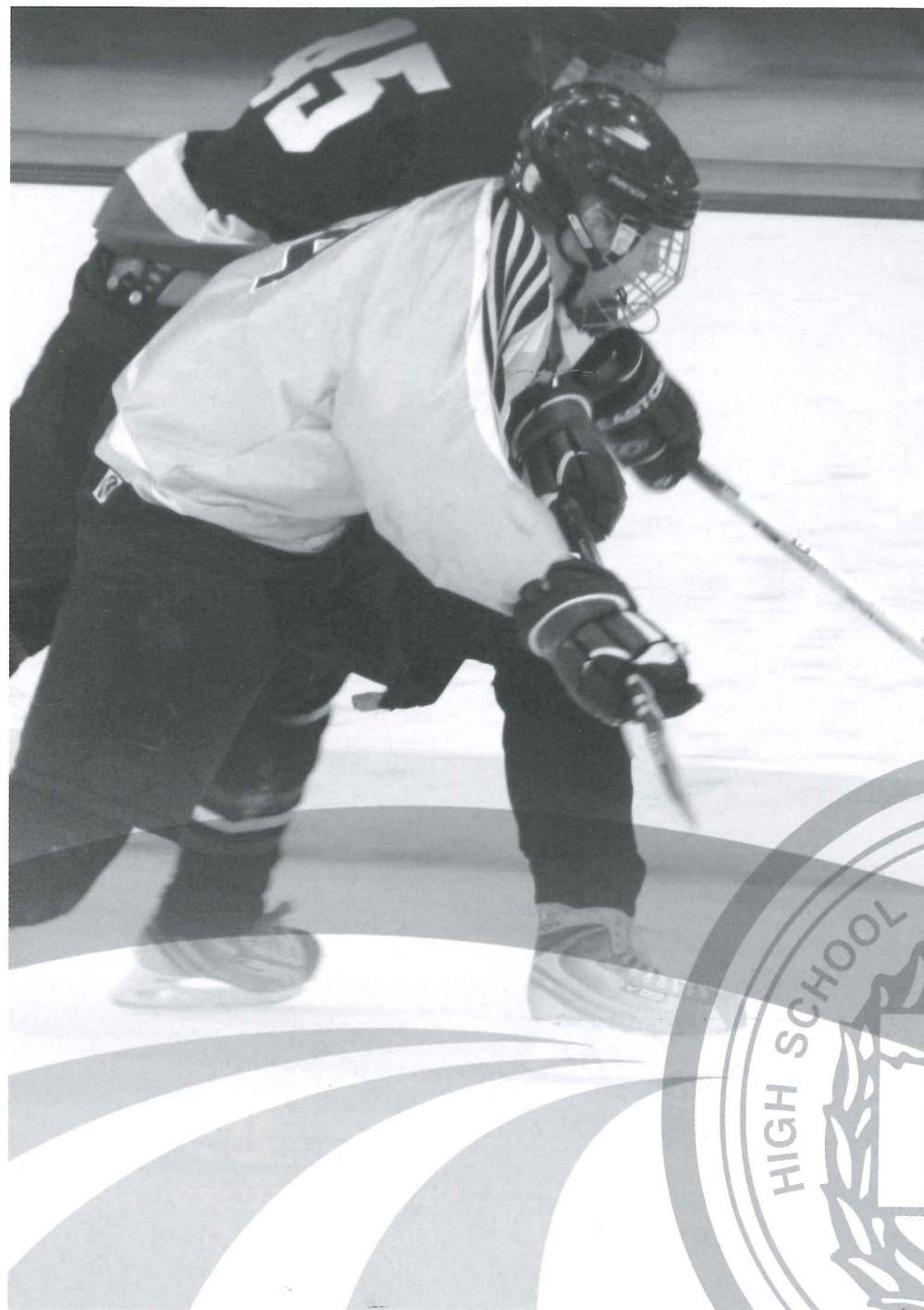

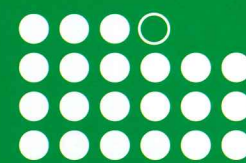
