

MINIMAL BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS

- · Respect the American flag and the National Anthem.
- · Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest.
- · Spectators must wear clothing that covers the entire torso. Those who do not comply or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this behavior expectation.
- The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators.
- · Any attendee ejected from a NDHSAA tournament venue will be banned from the venue(s) for the remainder of the event.
- · Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way.

- Hand held signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing surface is NOT allowed.
- · Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues. Exception - Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials.
- · Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited.
- · Confetti is banned at all NDHSAA tournament venues. Tournament staff is instructed to confiscate such articles at the door.
- · Objects shall not be thrown into the stands at any NDHSAA tournament venue.
- The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited for any persons at NDHSAA tournament venues.



1971 NDHSAA BOYS HOCKEY STATE CHAMPIONS – GRAND FORKS CENTRAL

The 1971 NDHSAA Boys Hockey State Tournament marked the first time the event was hosted outside of Grand Forks. The Fargo Coliseum played host to the 1971 state tournament with Grand Forks Central, Grand Forks Red River, Grafton, Bottineau, Fargo South, Fargo North, Devils Lake and Park River all qualifying for the tournament.

Grand Forks Central, winners of the previous four NDHSAA-sponsored boys hockey state tournaments and 10 overall titles counting the six non-sponsored state crowns won from 1961-1966, cruised to a 12-1 win over Park River in the quarterfinals and a 3-1 win over Fargo North in the semifinals. Central would meet Fargo South in the state title game, with the Bruins making their first ever appearance in a boys hockey state championship game.

South played stingy defense keeping Grand Forks Central in check through two periods of play, but penalties caught up with the Bruins in the third period. With two Bruins in the penalty box, Central's Dave Lamb got a shot past South goalie Rob Oster four minutes, 35 seconds into the third period. Central would add another power-play goal later in the third when Terry Paukert scored at the 11:02 mark giving Central a big swing of momentum after a goal by Gary Purpur was wiped off the scoresheet due to an offside infraction 29 seconds prior to Paukert's goal.

Central finished the season with a 21-1-1 record. The victory over the Bruins gave Central its 11th state championship in boys hockey dating back to the 1960-61 season.

1972 NDHSAA BOYS HOCKEY STATE CHAMPIONS – GRAND FORKS CENTRAL

The 1972 NDHSAA Boys Hockey State Tournament championship game featured a rematch between 11-time state champion Grand Forks Central and Fargo South. Since the NDHSAA began sponsoring the boys hockey state tournament in 1967, the 1972 final between Central and South marked the first time the same two teams met in back-to-back state championship games.

Like the 1971 title game, Central came away with the win and another state title to add to its dynasty. Central defeated South 6-1 in the championship game played at Grand Forks Arena.

Prior to the state title game against the Bruins, Central needed defeat cross-town rival Grand Forks Red River in the semifinals, which proved to be a tough undertaking as Central edged the Roughriders 4-3 in overtime. Max Nelson provided the game-winning goal against Red River in a game that saw Central trail by scores of 2-0 and 3-2.

In the title game, Central fell behind 1-0 when South's Paul Engen scored one minute, 24 seconds into the game. Once again, Central would need to rally if they were to come away with a win – and Central did in a big way scoring six unanswered goals on its way to the program's 12 consecutive state championship.

Dave Como got Central on the scoreboard tying the game 1-1 at the 3:33 mark of the first period. Greg Dvorak scored at the 12:49 mark of the first period and 29 second later, Central got a goal from defenseman Duane Meagher for a 3-1 lead entering the first intermission.

Greg Lindgren, Brad Spicer and Meagher each scored a goal for Central in the second period. Both teams skated to a draw in the third period as Central closed out the win and a 18-5 season.

1996 NDHSAA BOYS HOCKEY STATE CHAMPIONS – GRAND FORKS RED RIVER

Grand Forks Red River would regain the top spot in North Dakota boys hockey during the 1995-96 season and also start a three-season string of dominance that helped reinforce the school's place as one of the state's top programs.

The Roughriders, winners of four straight NDHSAA boys hockey state titles from 1987-1990, hadn't advanced to the state title game for five seasons following the four-peat, but that would change at the 1996 NDHSAA State Tournament.

Red River cruised to a 7-1 win over Bismarck High in the quarterfinals setting up a matchup with Fargo North in the semifinals – a game the Roughriders won 4-3 in double overtime.

Red River would meet Grafton/Park River in the state championship game. The Spoilers were making their fourth appearance in the state championship game in six seasons.

The Roughriders' momentum from the overtime win against North spilled over into the championship as the squad grabbed control early, built a lead and ultimately won the program's seventh boys hockey state championship by edging the Spoilers 4-2.

Scoring goals for Red River in the state championship game were Tim Skarperud, Tanner Johnson, David Ottinger and Grant Potulny. Skarperud scored three goals in Red River's win over North and earned Tournament MVP honors finishing the tournament with four goals and four assists. Red River finished the season 20-6.

1997 NDHSAA BOYS HOCKEY STATE CHAMPIONS – GRAND FORKS RED RIVER


Powered by the junior trio of Grant Potulny, Mike Johnson and David Ottinger, Grand Forks Red River was able to secure a repeat as NDHSAA boys hockey state champions at the 1997 state tournament.

Potulny, Johnson and Ottinger combined for eight goals and 18 points during the 1997 state tournament. The trio only accounted for one goal in Red River's 2-1 win over Grand Forks Central in the state championship game, but it was a big one – the tournament winner.


Prior to the meeting with the Knights in the title game, the two schools met three other times during the season – twice in regular season series and in the East Region Tournament. Each game was tight.

Goals scored by Nathan Schwan in the first period and Potulny in the second period were enough to give Red River its eighth state title in program history and a 2-1-1 advantage over Central in the season series. In the four games played between the two squads during the 1996-97 season, the Roughriders edged the Knights in total goals 6-5.

Potulny earned Tournament MVP honors and Red River finished the season 21-5-1.
