If interscholastic competition is to succeed in one of its prime functions, that of developing good citizenship, it is necessary that our entire group radiate proper sportsmanship conduct. Sportsmanship is good citizenship in action. The promoting of sportsmanship is everyone's responsibility.

NDHSAA MINIMAL BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS:

- Respect the American flag and the National Anthem.
- Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest.
- Spectators must wear clothing that covers the entire torso. Those who do not comply or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this behavior expectation.
- The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators.
- Any attendee ejected from a NDHSAA tournament venue will be banned from the venue(s) for the remainder of the event.
- Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way.
- Hand held signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing surface is NOT allowed.
- Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues. Exception – Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials.
- Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited.
- Confetti is banned at all NDHSAA tournament venues. Tournament staff is instructed to confiscate such articles at the door.
- Objects shall not be thrown into the stands at any NDHSAA tournament venue.
- The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited for any persons at NDHSAA tournament venues.

NORTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

I. Membership

The NDHSAA is a non-profit organization of the high schools in the state of North Dakota. All schools eligible for membership belong to the Association. Membership is granted upon application of the School Board, at which time the school agrees to enforce the rules which the members have established and to participate in the legislative process of modification and revision of rules to fit the changing needs of member schools and students.

II. Purpose as per NDHSAA Constitution

The purpose of the Association is to contribute to the education of high school boys and girls of North Dakota by:

- Administering a program of interscholastic activities, clinics, contests and festivals among its member schools.
- Elevating the standards of good sportsmanship and encouraging growth in good citizenship, not only of high school students, but also of all others who come in contact with school activities.
- Protecting member schools, students, and personnel from exploitation of special interest groups.
- Encouraging pride in scholastic achievement as a fundamental basis for a well-balanced activities program.
- Supplementing the dramatic, literary, music and physical education programs of the schools and giving due emphasis to those tendencies which promise best to promote the mental and physical health and social well-being of all students.

III. Brief History

The activities association was founded in 1908 under the name of the High School League and originally was concerned only with athletics. In 1923 the state organization became affiliated with the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations (NFHS). A full-time executive director was employed in 1949, an assistant was added in 1963, a girls sports supervisor in 1973, and a music and speech coordinator in 1978.

In 1950 the Consolidated League, an organization of the smaller schools of the state, affiliated with the High Schools League, thereby uniting all high schools of the state under one organization. Music and speech activities were placed under the direction of the Association in 1955, and the name was changed to the North Dakota High School Activities Association at that time. Schools in the League were all one class for basketball competition from 1908 to 1932. A two-class system was used from 1933 to 1947 and a three-class system from 1948 to 1963. In 1964 the two-class system was restored and this arrangement has been in effect since then up to the present time. Official state champions have been named in boys track since 1908 and in boys basketball since 1914. Official champions in other sports were later added as follows: boys golf and boys tennis 1938, baseball 1950; wrestling 1959; boys cross country 1961; boys hockey 1967; girls track, golf and tennis 1966; girls gymnastics 1969; girls basketball 1974; girls swimming 1974; boys swimming 1975 and girls cross country 1979. State football champions were determined off and on between 1916 and 1959, when the practice was discontinued, but were restored in 1975 when NDHSAA officially sponsored Class A, Class B and 9-man championship games. The NDHSAA Dakota Bowl - a one day event where all three football championship games are played - was introduced in 1993. In 1997, the current four division format (Division AAA, Division AA, Division A and 9-man) for NDHSAA football was introduced.

Basketball tournaments for girls were conducted by the Consolidated League for a number of years and by the NDHSAA from 1951 to 1960, at which time they were discontinued because of the small number of schools fielding teams. Girls basketball was reinstated as an NDHSAA-sponsored activity in 1973 on a district level, with separate state Class A and Class B champions being named since 1974. Class A girls volleyball state champions were first named in 1984 and Class B girls volleyball state champions were first named in 1989. Boys state soccer champions were first named in 1995 and girls state soccer champions in 1996. Girls state hockey champions were first named in 2003. Girls softball champions were first named in 2009 with separated Division A & B champions in 2012.

V. Registration of Officials and Interpretation Meetings

In the 2020-21 school year 1,342 officials registered with the NDHSAA. These men and women are furnished rule books for the sports in which they officiate, and examinations are provided annually in baseball, basketball, football, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, volleyball and wrestling. Officials are also required to complete online rules clinics in all sports and workshops in baseball, basketball, football, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

VI. School Administrator Meetings

The NDHSAA holds mandatory administrator meetings throughout North Dakota in September. The meetings cover various topics member schools should be aware of entering the school year.

VII. Cheerleader Clinics

The NDHSAA has recognized the importance of safety in cheerleading. Because of this, the Association has added rules/safety clinics for head cheer coaches of all member schools who have cheerleaders. These clinics recognize the importance of informing cheer coaches of proper safety techniques as well as emphasizing the responsibility of cheerleaders for sportsmanship and crowd control.

VIII. Organization of Association

NDHSAA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of 11 members. Three Board members shall be chosen from Class A Schools, one each from two geographical areas and one at-large. Four administrators of Class B schools, one high school principal as a member-at-large and one athletic administrator. These representatives are elected by the membership as a whole, with each school having one vote. In addition, a representative of the North Dakota School Boards Association and the Superintendent of Public Instruction serve as a member of the Board.

REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

The superintendent or high school principal or athletic administrator of each school serves as a member of the representative assembly, with each school being entitled to one vote. An annual meeting is held each year to adopt rules and regulations governing interscholastic contests and eligibility regulations. All such rules are made by the representative assembly.

DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The district activities are controlled and managed by committees elected by school officials in each area.

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS
